Pottery (Posters)

Kataret es-Samra is strategically located on the interface of the ghor and the zor of the East Jordan Valley ca. 40 km. NW of Amman and ca. 5 km. north of the confluence of the Jordan River and the Wadi Zarqa (Biblical Jabbok). In 1985, as part of a larger project, I directed the excavation of a small (three-week) sounding on the Kataret es-Samra plateau that produced a decorated pottery that I described in the preliminary publications as a 7 \UWc Jh\JW. This pottery is now housed at the Harvard Museum of the Ancient Near East (formerly, the Harvard Semitic Museum) where I had been preparing it for integration into the HMANE catalogue system when the Covid-19 virus struck. After the campus reopens, I plan to continue that work with the goal of expanding access to the material and eventual publication.
